

# Annual Congregational Meeting:

As many of you know, each November on the second Sunday our church affirms the financial boards proposed budget and affirms elders as well as financial board members. The church bylaws call for an **Annual Congregational meeting**. Other than having affirmation votes the last few years, there has not been a congregational meeting to talk about the direction of the church. The elders decided we should have a meeting to discuss the ministries of the church, the direction we are heading as well as organizational needs. Our **tentative agenda**, in addition to ministry, is to discuss the **building** (primarily the old building and the new addition currently being worked on), **bylaws**, ministries at the Elementary School, **budget** for 2106, and have a Q&A time with staff and elders. The meeting could be a bit long so we plan to eat lunch first. We will have a **signup sheet** for desserts and side dishes. We will have meat and cheese trays for sandwiches. We will have childcare available.

## 411 on 4/14

I think it's been a while since I last gave an update on how things are going with 4/14, so I think I should take a few minutes and let you all in on what has been going on.

Starting this August we opened up the old elementary building, hereby known as the 4/14 and Outreach Center, to the entire community and really made an effort to invite youth who have never been a part of church. The first night I can remember going into a side room to pray, thinking that we might get 30 kids, I came out of the room and saw that there were only a few people in the lobby getting signed in. I was a little disappointed, that all our efforts had failed. I was amazed when just a few minutes later, the lobby was completely filled with kids and parents. WE HAD 55 KIDS THAT NIGHT! This was twice what we had been averaging last year. I was a little stunned. Our numbers now fluctuate, anywhere from 45 to 65 kids on a given night.

Those numbers bring some challenges. These challenges I intend to meet head on, by praying and taking them straight to God. I now meet with a few people from 5:15-5:40 to pray for the kids and all the issues that come along with the unchurched teenagers we see every Wednesday. That is really the major test. We have found a way to bring in several students who have never been in church a day in their lives. They come from families that don't go to church, so they don't know what you should and shouldn't do in church.

I need your help: First I need more prayer partners, people who are willing to bring these precious creations of Christ to his thrown in prayer. I also need bodies, people who would come out and invest in the lives of kids. Where would you be if someone didn't take the time to pray for and disciple you? Please come along side those of us working with the youth of Neoga and help bring them closer to Christ. *"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us."* Hebrews 12:1. Please come and be a part of this cloud of witnesses and keep sin from tripping up the kids in our community.

God has given the community of Neoga so much to be thankful for at the former elementary school. There have been several ministries started, or already in existence, that are utilizing the building. This has been a huge blessing to the community of Neoga.

First is the 4/14 youth group that meets every Wednesday from 6:00-8:00 pm. Matt leads the community youth, ages 6th-12th grade, in a time of worship. To start the evening the kids have 45 minutes of free time. Here they can play basketball, football, and/or gaga ball. During this time the youth can simply hang out or take advantage of the gaming systems available. After hang out time there is 30 minutes of worship. The youth have been blessed to have the Grace United Methodist praise band to lead them in their time of worship. Last is about 45 minutes of teaching, where the middle school and high school go to their respective rooms and have a time of bible study. What an awesome time for our kids to come together to worship our God.

> We are really excited to see God's plan unfolding on the first Thursday of each month in our town of Neoga. We have seen growth in the number of people who have utilized the resources that the community has generously put their energy towards.

> > The first of these ministries is the **Community Clothesline.** This is a place where people can come and receive, at no cost, new and gently used clothing from infants to adults. They are fortunate to have some retail businesses in Illinois donate new items. Another blessing is a room just for storage, where they don't have to climb stairs. This new space enables everyone to breathe freely...literally. They have a new room to sort donated items and two rooms for people to browse. The Community Clothesline is now wheelchair accessible, and has allowed us to reach more people.

#### Give Thanks continued...

Another huge blessing is the expanded space for the *Neoga Community Food Pantry*. Compared to the last space it has more than doubled in size. Now they have plenty of room for people to come in and "shop". In addition volunteers are able to pack boxes and organize without bumping into each other. Plus, those who make use of the pantry are now able to wait in a warm space and enjoy food and fellowship.

The last Thursday ministry is the *community meal*. This fellowship has really brought the other ministries and the community together. The meal provides time for local ministers to sit, talk. and pray with people of Neoga. We have seen the fellowship time during the meals increase and also bring smiles to people faces.

Another outreach is the **Backpack ministry**. This ministry enables kids to have food over the weekend while not at school. Food is delivered to the school and put in student's backpacks by a school employee so that it is done with as much privacy as possible. We have heard from a young student, "that this is the food his mom orders from school." This was told to us with a smile on his face. This new space has enabled the ministry to set up shelves for storage and not have to pack up their supplies weekly.

The last and newest ministry is the *after school program*. This was started to help alleviate the crunch that some parents felt with the earlier school dismissal this year. They have put to use the cafeteria, gym, playground, and two of the classrooms. They have snack, play time, and homework assistance. The school has graciously agreed to help with transportation to help families with this new change.
