
September 4, 2014


October 3, 2014 (Friday)


knowledge of Jesus and grow deeply in their faith. I take seriously what Jesus told His disciples in Matthew 28, we are to baptize AND teach them to obey.

Many kids aren't getting that, this is why 75% of young Christians leave the church after high school. I believe this is because they haven't been properly prepared by their churches and youth ministries. God has instilled a passion in me to help grow students in their knowledge and faith in Jesus, to prepare them for the world that is going to attack and oppress them. 1 Peter 3:15 tells us that we should always be prepared to give a defense of our faith, I believe that this the job God has called me to, preparing youth to be able to give a defense to THEIR faith, not just repeating answers they have heard, that they don't truly believe, but giving a defense to the faith that they possess.

The goal of the series was to highlight the <u>biblical</u> basis for stronger relationships in the church and particularly to highlight the need to participate in small groups. The first Christians met in homes most frequently although they sometimes met in the temple courts or open air spaces. They were tight knit groups of close friends as opposed to the loose knit group of strangers we have become...

Over the course of the series we addressed the following items:

- 1. What is the church?
 - It is a local assembly of Christ's followers, it is not a building.
- 2. What is the churches mission?
 - To make disciples (followers). The mission was given to the Apostles just before Christ's ascension, spelled out in Matthew 28 and Luke 24 among others...
- 3. What were the disciplines that uniquely defined the church?
 Using Acts 2:42 as a basis we learned that the first century Christians were DEVOTED to the following:
 - The Apostles Teaching. This means they were devoted to WHAT the apostles taught and practiced it! Not merely listeners of the word.
 - Fellowship. This means sharing with those in need, being hospitable, bearing one another's burdens and encouraging each other. It meant being self-less, humble, gentle, looking out for others interests and being unified in Spirit.

- Breaking bread and/or The Lord's Supper. They shared meals with one another and would remember the Lord together as they practiced his command to eat the bread, which represented his broken body and the cup which represents his shed blood.
- Prayer. Prayer is what makes all other disciplines of the Christian life a vital reality, prayer makes all service, fellowship, and shared meals a spiritual activity. Prayer, when woven into the fabric of our daily lives as Christians, brings life, fruit, and blessing...
- 4. One of the primary responsibilities Christ gave his church (Acts 1:8)?

 Jesus said, "And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere..."

 The Apostle Paul was deeply convicted about this responsibility Acts 20:24 But my life is worth nothing to me unless I use it for finishing the work assigned me by the Lord Jesus—the work of telling others the Good News about the wonderful grace of God.
- 5. Our final message was on the abilities the Holy Spirit gives to accomplish the mission and to fulfill the responsibilities of the church?

The gifts he gives are personal (we all get them, at least one) and corporate (all gifts given are a commonly held to be used to benefit all).

My hope and prayer is that this series of messages has impacted your desire for deeper, more fulfilling, relationships within the church and with Christ. We are beginning a new small group ministry this fall and this series has been designed to be a catalyst.

Remember the first century church didn't ask people to join the church... They asked them to BE the church! Let's BE the church!
