# **4/14**UPDATE

4/14 is going great and we are making some changes. I have recently been reading a book called "Herding Cats, Teaching and Leading in a Postmodern World", in reading this book I have come to understand we need to make some changes in what we do. Church is going to change, it will look different than it ever has, we need to embrace these changes and lead people to Christ. Now don't think I am turning into a heretic, some aspects of the church should never change: God is the perfect creator of Heaven and Earth and we are made in His image. We have free will and have sinned against God, separating ourselves from Him. God came to Earth to be born of a virgin, lived a perfect life and died for our sins and raised to life on the third day. He was both fully God and fully man, at the same time and will return for us. The Bible is the perfect word of God, without fault and useful to teach us today.

For years "church" has been based around weekly, large group gatherings. As time progresses those gatherings will still happen but "church" will be when people get together in community. As a youth minister, I notice this, "church" happens for kids in talking with me at lunch, meeting at basketball games or seeing each other out around town and talking. Many of them experience "church" at the park on Wednesdays while they are waiting for youth group to begin.

Kids today experience God while they are living life, but they are still flocking to our weekly, large youth group meetings. This got me thinking, "Why are kids coming and how can we better help them live community?" Through talking this over with Jennifer, we realized that many of the kids we have coming to youth group don't have a large community to be a part of, they have small groups of friends and they come to 4/14 because they are seeking that community. So, what can we do to support that community? Pizza!

We have a lot of kids who realize if they ride the bus home on Wednesday, they won't have a ride to youth group, so they walk to the park and hang out there until we open the doors. Many of these kids are not getting supper until they get home that night. Last month I asked how many of the kids were hungry and 75% raised their hands, they are teenagers, but when I asked how many hadn't eaten supper yet about 50% raised their hands. Do you know that Grace's backpack food ministry that provides food for hungry kids over the weekend packs food for 71 kids in our area every week? We have hungry kids.

We have started having a meal every Wednesday night now, it's just pizza, but it matters to the kids. It is easier to hear about Jesus when we have food in our stomachs. It is also easy to live in community while eating together. Papa Johns in Mattoon has stepped up to help us provide this food, through the hard work of one of their managers they are providing us pizza at a very good price.
