
JESUS WAS IN A SMALL GROUP. I'M JUST SAYIN'...

Building/Facilities Update...

As many of you know a great deal of time, effort and prayer has been given to our facilities over the last year or more. The result from the planning and praying is moving along even though it is a bit slow.

This past Spring/Summer the decision was made by the elders and financial board to investigate the costs to build a multi-purpose facility in the empty lot next to the Clothesline house (corner of Locust and 6th). The layout for the facility has been shared with Longhorn and AKRA builders to use in drafting a proposal. I expect to receive those proposals in early January.

The rough drawing (to the left) includes a kitchen that is comparable in size to the new one at the Methodist church, a fellowship hall with capacity around 300, office space and space for the Clothesline ministry. The overall size of the building is roughly 120 X 76 or about 9,000 square feet. Each of these new spaces in the multi-purpose building are needed for the growth and health of our ministries, both in ministry to our church family and outreach to the community.

Once we have an approved proposal and the financial means we will build the new facility (phase 1) and then address the old church building (phase 2). Once the old church is removed, we will remodel our existing building and open up the foyer/welcome center and build new childcare/nursery rooms (phase 3).

In the near future, I hope to have a small committee to plan our fundraising efforts. More will be shared as we move forward.

Please spend time praying about our facilities. We trust God to supply our needs including the space to serve and minister.



Missions Updates...



This has been the goal of the Missions Committee for the past year – to spread God's Word in our town, our region, and throughout the world. The missions budget has locally supported Heartland Christian Village and the Neoga Community Food Pantry with a monthly gift. An additional year end gift was given to Heartland to help with their concrete project. In our area, we have given a monthly donation to Oblong Christian Children's Home, EIU Christian Campus House, and Oil Belt Christian Service Camp.

Oil Belt was also given a year end donation to help with the purchase of their new building. We have financially contributed to a variety of international missions through several special donations and projects. In June, VBS materials for the mission trip were purchased and transported to Belize. This fall, 50 shoeboxes were purchased for Operation Christmas Child. The shipping for these gifts was also paid. In addition, materials were purchased through Samaritan's Purse for 93 children to participate in "The Greatest Journey", a follow-up discipleship program to Operation Christmas Child that helps children learn more about Jesus. (First Christian Church donated a total of 93 shoebox gifts.) And in the fall, at least three children found monthly sponsors through Compassion, International's Release 3 Campaign.

Our Job as Christians...

In Luke chapter 10 Jesus is asked by an expert in the law "What must a person do to be saved?" Jesus answered in the typical Jewish teaching method: he answered with a question.
