# **Mission Spotlight**

## Did You Know?

- 1. Worldwide, over 600 million children live in extreme poverty.
- 2. 3 billion people live on less than \$2.50 per day.
- 3. 1.6 billion people live without electricity.
- 4. 11 percent of the world's population, nearly 800 million people, do not have access to safe drinking water.
- 5. 2.5 billion people do not have access to appropriate sanitation.
- 6. Nearly 2,000 children die each day from disease/illness caused by unsafe drinking water and poor sanitation.
- 7. One in seven people in the world will go to bed hungry tonight.
- 8. Every day 16,000 children die from hunger related causes.
- 9. There are over 2 million children worldwide in commercial sex trade.
- 10. Up to 50% of children worldwide report being abused.

Compassion International is a childadvocacy ministry that pairs compassionate people with those who are suffering from poverty, hunger, illness, and those in need of Christ. The Mission Statement of Compassion says, "In response to the Great Commission, Compassion International exists as an advocate for children, to release them from their spiritual, economic, social, and physical poverty and to enable them to become responsible and fulfilled Christian adults."

Compassion International currently has over 6500 international church partners, over 1.5 million sponsored children and report that over 120,000 kids and moms gave their lives to Christ over the past year. Their focus is on a Christ-centered approach to all programs and ministries, a commitment to children to address their physical, economic, spiritual, and social needs, and a commitment to partner with local churches to bring Christ to children worldwide.

"When you reap the harvest of your land, don't reap the corners of your field or gather the gleanings. Leave them for the poor and the foreigners. I am God, your God." -Leviticus 23:22 (MSG) Several members of our congregation sponsor children through Compassion, and they send and receive letters from their children regularly. During college, while on a Mission trip to Brazil, my wife, Kate, was able to meet one of our sponsored children, Clayton. While meeting was a wonderful experience for both of them, the one thing that made the biggest impression on Kate was the safety of the environment. "The campus provided enough space for a few classrooms, for eating quarters, and a safe courtyard where the kids could play soccer without interference from the drug lords and violence outside the gates. There were also small living quarters for workers and orphans so they could live safely on campus. It wasn't extravagant, but it was nice. It appeared as if every drop of money was used wisely to provide what the kids and workers needed."

Lives are being changed. We truly can make a difference. By supporting a child we have the opportunity to provide food, clean water, education, health care, and an opportunity to share the Gospel. What an awesome opportunity to be able to partner with an organization, to be the hands and feet of Christ, and to provide for the material and spiritual needs of children. Please prayerfully consider partnering with Compassion by sponsoring a child or becoming a prayer partner for these children.

In chapter 11, verses 1 and 2 the writer of Hebrews tells us,

We have a lot going on this month in 4/14:

- Please pray for the group headed to CIY in June, pray that God's Word will seep into their hearts and effect them.
- June will mark the end of 4/14 for the summer. Please pray that the kids will be safe and focused on God.
- Open Gym starts in July. Pray for kids to come and be safe and that all the churches will work together to bring glory to God.
- Doug has started working on the musical, the Gospel put to music basically. Please pray especially that God works through all the people involved in the production. Pray for the adults that we might lead discussions and help the cast understand the depth of Christ's love for them.

"Faith is the confidence that what we hope for will actually happen; it gives us assurance about things we cannot see. Through their faith, the people in days of old earned a good reputation."

He then goes on to discuss how that faith was put into action. He talks about Abel bringing the better offering. He mentions Enoch being taken from this life and never experiencing death. He mentions Noah and the ark, Abraham and his faith to leave his people and trusting in God for the promise of offspring. The writer goes on and takes a tour of faith through the Old Testament. In verse 6 he says "*And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to Him must believe that God exists and that He rewards those who sincerely seek Him.*"

Faith can be pretty tricky sometimes; it can be hard to have confidence in what we cannot see actually happening. I think that is why the writer of Hebrews puts in this section the great examples of faith; he wants us to see how faith has been lived out over the years. In chapter 12 verse 1 "*Therefore*, *since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us.*"I love that phrase, ä huge crowd of witnesses" because we are week people and we need to look out and see a large group of people with the faith to follow God through all manner of circumstances.

When I look at the kids who have started coming to 4/14 (youth group), I have realized that many of them come from families that don't go to church. They have no idea about the Old Testament and don't know how to apply the Bible to their lives. With God's help I am trying to fix those things. The Middle school is working our way through Genesis, talking about the faith of God's servants there. We are also practicing something I have called "A great cloud of witnesses" (a throwback to my NIV days).

The last Wednesday night of every month I have invited a different person to come in and share some of their testimony with the kids, a way to show them real flesh and blood examples of what faith is. In March John Letizia came in and discussed his growing up and coming to faith, just ask him sometime about making it rain. The kids loved listening to him talk about praying to God to identify who he should marry and then meeting Reeni as she walked down to do laundry, a story of putting his faith in God and how he has been blessed. In April, Doug McClure also graced us with his presence, talking to us about relying on God while surviving a cancer that should have killed him. In May, I brought my father in to talk about his trips to Africa and the faith of people living in completely different circumstances than ours.

Please pray for our kids as they hear these stories of faith and action so that they can see how God works in people's lives and how He can be working in their lives. Please pray that these times will help bolster the kids faith. Please also be praying for all the future "witnesses" that might be called upon that they can share their faith with the kids.
