
Who would like to go see a movie with our church family?

Axel Age 7 from Urban Burkina Faso

Bob Potter's Sunday school class has supported Axel for 2 yrs through *Compassion*. They have sent cards, coloring books, \$20 for birthday gifts and \$40 Christmas gifts for Axel and his twin brother. Cards are sent each holiday and Christian books. They receive letters from him and Fontella enjoys replying. Fontella would like to thank the class for their gift offering each month.

In Burkina Faso, about 44 % of the urban population live below the poverty line. The main urban centers in Burkina Faso are Ouagadougou, the capital city and Bobo-Dioulasso, the economic heart of the country. In recent years rural immigrants have flocked to these cities in search of work, swelling slums and the number of job seekers and stressing public services. Most of the immigrant lack formal education or professional skills.

Many of the children living in these areas can't go to school because there aren't enough public schools and private schools are too expensive. So every day thousands of children are in the streets shining shoes, working in bicycle repair shops, pushing rickshaws, or selling water for their employers. Girls go door-todoor with large plates on their heads selling fruits and vegetables to support their families.

Compassion began working in Burkina Faso in 2004. Currently more than 56,800 children are registered in 221 child development centers where they can prepare for a better future rather than laboring to help meet their families' financial needs. Most children attend the center for 8 hrs per week. Burkina Faso also has 401 mothers and babies served through the Child Survival Program.

August Mission Spotlight – Gospel for Asia

Gospel for Asia's mission is to share the Good News of Jesus with those who have never heard His name. The vast majority of these people live in the 10/40 Window, a rectangular shaped area on our globe extending from West Africa to East Asia, from 10 degrees to 40 degrees north of the equator. In this part of the world, millions live with little or no chance of ever hearing the name of Jesus. And many live in desperate poverty - over 80% of the world's poorest people live in the 10/40 Window. The Window also encompasses the majority of the world's Muslims, Hindus, and Buddhists.

With the ever-expanding population of people in Asia, the need for aid, education and Jesus' love is growing day by day. Gospel for Asia is involved in sharing the love of Christ through national missionaries. Each national missionary is a man or woman who already lives in Asia. In preparation for ministry they go through 3-years of intensive ministry training. The following advantages make them ideal to reach Asia: they move freely in areas restricted to outsiders and are accepted in good times and bad; they know the cultural taboos instinctively; they have already mastered the language or a related dialect; they live among the community, eating the same food, wearing the same clothes, and sharing the same cultural interests; and they have a passion and burden to reach their own people. Monetary gifts to Gospel for Asia help support these national missionaries. It only takes \$30 a month to help enable a national missionary to serve full-time to reach an unreached village

Through Gospel for Asia's Compassion Services teams, they help victims of natural disasters, reaching out to those affected by catastrophes such as floods, cyclones and tsunamis. They also serve in leprosy colonies, offer medical clinics in poor areas, and help widows and abandoned children in crisis situations by providing for tangible needs like food, clothing and shelter.

Although reaching Asia with Christ's love is an enormous task, there is hope through the children. Parents across Asia struggle to provide for their families. Children grow up illiterate, uneducated and taught they are worthless. More than 20 million boys and girls are trapped in social evils like child labor and prostitution in order to support their family. Gospel for Asia's Bridge of Hope turns these situations around for good. Children are educated and nurtured. Families experience Christ's love. More than 74,000 children have been helped so far and thousands of families have found faith in Christ as a result. A monthly gift of \$35 will provide sponsorship for a child through the Bridge of Hope program.

For over 30 years Gospel for Asia continues to bring aid and hope to some of the most downtrodden people in South Asia.
