The whole force of Bible statement is to increase our faith in the doctrine that prayer affects God, secures favors from God, which can be secured in no other way, and which will not be bestowed by God if we do not pray. The whole canon of Bible teaching is to illustrate the great truth that God hears and answers prayer. One of the great purposes of God in His book is to impress upon us indelibly the great importance, the priceless value, and the absolute necessity of asking God for the things which we need for time and eternity. He urges us by every consideration, and presses and warns us by every interest. He points us to His own Son, turned over to us for our good, as His pledge that prayer will be answered, teaching us that God is our Father, able to do all things for us and to give all things to us, much more than earthly parents are able or willing to do for their children.

Let us thoroughly understand ourselves and understand, also, this great business of prayer. Our one great business is prayer, and we will never do it well without we fasten to it by all binding force. We will never do it well without arranging the best conditions of doing it well. Satan has suffered so much by good praying that all his wily, shrewd and ensnaring devices will be used to cripple its performances.

Are you ready to Grow in 2016?

How are you today?

How is your relationship with Jesus? Are you growing in faith, obedience and in your service to Him? How is your prayer life? Do you make regular time to be alone with God?

If I had my wish, I would ask you personally and privately these questions with the hope that I could exhort you and encourage you to grow, to become the person God longs for you to be. God has so richly blessed you! He has given His son so that you could have your sins washed away and every barrier between Him and you removed. He did this because He wants each of us to have a strong. living, vibrant, and growing relationship with Him. God chose to influence and change the world through people. You are His chosen instrument and plan to manifest His glory on the earth. Nothing in creation, not even the angels of heaven, has been given the special privilege that most of us take for granted.

As you look ahead to the new year, ask yourself, ask God, what do I need to change? Do you need to give God more time in prayer, worship, and service? A good place to start is to make it your goal to read through the New Testament. A simple plan is included in the Evangel and available at the Welcome Center. The plan is setup for five minutes of reading per day, five days a week. All of us can give five minutes per day no matter how busy we are. Another good place to start is to sign up for one of the small groups. We have groups that meet on Sunday and Wednesday evenings. Being part of a small group is a great way to

build relationships with other members of God's family and help you feel part of the church. In addition to small groups, we have men's studies (Tuesday night), women's studies (Sunday night and Wednesday morning), and Sunday School at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday.

Growing in knowledge about God's Word through Bible studies is very important and aids in becoming more connected to the church as well. One of the most important, yet often neglected, ministries (personal and corporate) is prayer. It is a fact that God moves, changes, and influences our world today just as He did over 2,000 years ago when Christ walked the earth, but *He waits to be asked.* Christ said time and again to quote a few verses... "Whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it."

About corporate prayer it is said, "The weekly prayer meeting is the spiritual barometer for any local

You must choose to grow and improve, and, thankfully, the Holy Spirit is happy to help. Make a decision to attend our weekly prayer meetings on Sunday evenings.

God equips you and me for service.

Growing in faith, in the knowledge of God's word, and in your personal and corporate discipline of prayer are keys to becoming a mature Christian. As a result of your growing relationship, God equips you and me for service. Some are called and equipped to teach, to preach, and to lead, while others are called to demonstrate mercy, to perform acts of kindness or service. We are all called to serve depending on how God has gifted us. In most cases, your calling is simply a matter of you recognizing a need in the church and being willing to meet that need. Many needs or opportunities for service go unmet.

What's going on with 4/14? Well, a lot actually. I have been doing a lot of reading lately and am trying to implement much of what I have learned. The three most recent and influential books are as follows: *Jesus Centered Y outh Ministry* by Rick Lawrence, *Connect* by Jonathan Mckee, and *gods at War* by Kyle Idleman

In Jesus Centered Y outh Ministry, we are challenged by these words "The movement from 'mastering knowledge' and growing students' impetus to act on that knowledge, to something that looks and sounds more like a growing romance that 'ruins' the lover for the Beloved is at the core of the Jesus-centered ministry shift." Here at 4/14 we are striving to make sure Jesus is the center of all we do with the youth placed in our care. I want to see them move from a head knowledge about Jesus to an all-encompassing passion for a Savior who gave His all for us. I like to think of it this way, we all know a bullet proof vest can save our lives (head knowledge) but it doesn't do us any good unless we put it on (passion for our savior)."

Jonathan Mckee teaches us in *Connect* that we need to be investing in the youth we have. "Relationships are powerful. Without question, the entire Bible is

really about relationships; Our relationship with God and our relationship with others." It is our job to form relationships with the youth entrusted to us and for those relationships to point towards Christ. Think back on your own faith story, was there one person who invested in you and helped lead you to Christ? Most of us can think of that person or group, and see their efforts to lead us to Him. It is our job to, intentionally, be investing in others as well. This is called discipleship.

gods at War teaches us "Idolatry isn't just one of many sins; rather it's the one great sin that all others come from." What do we place on the throne of our hearts?
