FIVE CONDITIONS OF PREVAILING PRAYER by George Mueller

1. Entire dependence upon the merits and mediation of the Lord Jesus Christ, as the only ground of any claim for blessing. (See John 14:13-14; John 15:16)

John 14:13-14 - You can ask for anything in my name, and I will do it, so that the Son can bring glory to the Father. 14 Yes, ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it!

2. Separation from all known sin. If we regard iniquity in our hearts, the Lord will not hear us, for it would be sanctioning sin. (Psalm 66:18)

Psalm 66:18-20 - If I had not confessed the sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened. ¹⁹ But God did listen! He paid attention to my prayer. ²⁰ Praise God, who did not ignore my prayer or withdraw his unfailing love from me.

3. Faith in God's word of promise as confirmed by His oath. Not to believe Him is to make Him both a liar and a perjurer. (Hebrews 11:6; 6:13-20.)

Hebrews 11:6 - And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him.

4. Asking in accordance with His will. Our motives must be godly: we must not seek any gift of God to consume it upon our lusts. (1 John 5:14; James 4:3)

James 4:3 - And even when you ask, you don't get it because your motives are all wrong—you want only what will give you pleasure.

5. Importunity in supplication. There must be waiting on God and waiting for God, as the husbandman has long patience to wait for the harvest. (James 5:7; Luke 18:1-8)

James 5:7 - 7 Dear brothers and sisters,[a] be patient as you wait for the Lord's return. Consider the farmers who patiently wait for the rains in the fall and in the spring. They eagerly look for the valuable harvest to ripen.

Preparations for CIY are going on right now for 4/14. At CIY youth get a chance to leave their normal life behind for a bit and go off to focus on God and what He means to them. Last year was my first experience with this organization and I was deeply moved by what I saw, I know the kids were moved even more than I was.

Believe is a weekend event for middle schoolers, because only a crazy person would do a week long event with middle schoolers. At Believe we talked about King David and what it means to be "after God's heart". We had some awesome worship, teaching and some really great time together talking about things and growing together. This year we will be talking about John the Baptist titled "Switching on Truth".

The high schoolers got to experience CIY Move, a week long time of worship and focusing on God and his message for us. We worked our way through the life of Daniel and learned what it really meant to live for God. This week was amazing and I really saw God working through the lives of our teens. This year we will learn what it means to be a Kingdom worker.

CIY is a great opportunity for our kids, but the price can be overwhelming to some students. I don't want to see anyone left behind because they can't afford the price tag. To help meet their needs I am asking for your help.

Starting on February 7, there will be a board in the back of the sanctuary with envelopes from 1-100 written on them. If you feel led to help, please take one of the envelopes and commit to putting, at least, the amount written on the envelope into it. A Helping of Servanthood

"⁹As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him. ¹⁰While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. ¹¹When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹²On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. ¹³But go and learn what this means: I desire mercy, not sacrifice.'¹⁰ For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." Matthew 9:9-13

What an amazing privilege to have God's unconditional love, in which he sent his only son to seek and save the lost. In this context it was by sharing a meal with the unworthy. It is powerful to see how Matthew, a tax collector, no questions asked, just got up and followed Jesus. Then they sat down with other "tax collectors and sinners" to share a meal. It was in this fellowship that they truly did see Christ, not only physically (what a privilege!) but for whom he truly was, their Savior. Christ did not seek the Pharisees, but those whose hearts were desperate for him. Jesus calls us to be servants and to love one another.

As Peter's dream in Acts 10 states, he thought there were certain foods he was taught as a child to never eat. However Jesus tells Peter in his dream "Do not call something unclean if God has made it clean." Peter was having a difficult time following what was ask of him because of his upbringing. Sometimes our ideas or what we have been taught do not match up with God's plan. But out of love and obedience we need to work diligently to follow the opportunities he places before us.

We have been blessed with the churches coming together and working alongside each other in the love of Christ. One of the biggest blessings we have seen is the fellowship that has come out of these meals. It has been pure joy watching Mel, Matt, or Steve Massengill sit and talk to people they may have not known before this meal. This meal is not only to feed our physical bodies but to help feed us spiritually.
