

## A GUIDE FOR PRAYING FOR PRODIGAL LOVED ONES

Excerpt from "Prayer: The Timeless Secret of High-Impact Leaders" by Dave Early

One of the greatest stories ever told is the narrative Jesus gave of the prodigal son. It is the tale of a young man who asked for his inheritance prematurely, then ran off and wasted it in wild living. Finally, he came to his senses and went home to his father's house. I love the statement Jesus made revealing the awesome love of the father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him"(Luke 15:20).

Prodigals do come home in response to prayer. Maybe you have loved ones who have wandered far from "home." Luke 15 gives a good guide for praying for them:

## LORD, PLEASE:

Bring them to a place of famine and need (v.14).

Create within them holy hunger and "homesickness" (vv. 16,17).

Cause them to come to thier senses (v.17).

Draw them home (v.18).

Give them the gift of repentance (vv. 18-21).

Give us welcoming grace (v.20).

# Missions Committee Update

This verse has provided direction for the missions committee in determining our yearly budget. We want to be a part of spreading the gospel locally, regionally, and throughout the world. Monthly donations are given to the following area ministries: Heartland Christian Village, the Neoga Food Pantry, Oil Belt Christian Service Camp, EIU Campus House, Oblong Christian Children's Home, and Ryan and Melinda Hicks who are missionaries through One Mission Society. Please keep the Hicks family in your prayers as they will be making their second trip to Africa March 28-April 10. We hope to have Ryan and Melinda visit and tell us more about their mission work after they return from this trip.

The missions committee contributed \$550 to the CIY fund. As many of the youth are learning about Jesus for the first time, we felt this was definitely a true mission that we wanted to support. A donation of the same amount was made to Ingraham Christian Church for their upcoming trip to Belize June 5-10. Alan, Linda, and Heather Baker will be going on this trip. They will be serving at an orphanage. They will be involved with construction projects there, but are most looking forward to loving on the kids. They will again be working with Thirst Missions. They ask that you pray for them and the other 5 members of their team – that God will be glorified through them and that He will equip them to do the work He has already prepared for them to do there. And that if the work is to be done outside, that He will once again display His mighty power and stop the rain!

This year a different international mission will be spotlighted each quarter and given a gift of \$300. Because of our past partnership and connection with the people of Belize, the first ministry to be supported is Thirst Missions. Their theme verse is John 4:13-14: "Jesus answered, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become n him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.'" # Thank You...

He is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight" (Isaiah 42:1).

Servanthood is a key theme in the lyrical words of Isaiah 41—53. God uses this term to describe the people of Israel, the coming Messiah, and others.

Interestingly, "servant" and "chosen" are often together in these chapters. (See, for <u>example, 41:8</u>; 43:10; <u>and 44:1</u>.) Isn't it an odd combination? When I picture a chosen person, I see an adopted child, a best friend, or an elected ruler. But not a servant. The word *chosen* points to high regard and honor. The word *servant* describes someone quiet and humble, working hard.

But God's chosen are his servants. His people Israel were his servants, a people called to bear witness to him and to provide the human ancestry of his Son. Jesus is *The Chosen One*, the One by whom the world was made and by whom it will be judged, yet who "did not come to be served, but to serve" (<u>Matthew 20:28</u>). We, too, are chosen by God and are called to serve.

So what are your servant tasks today? Do they include changing a diaper and making dinner? Or preparing a report and making a sales call? Maybe it's supporting people on the team you lead or wrestling through a decision that will impact hundreds. Is it patiently listening to a spouse or a friend, holding back your own needs for a time? Or perhaps it's cleaning things up and running the errands. Maybe you'll cross paths with a stranger in need today.

Did you notice what else God says about his servant, his chosen one, in the words above? God upholds the servant. And more: God delights in that servant. While the servant serves, God supports and rejoices, he encourages and enjoys. Who knew servants had it so good!
