### Purpose in Prayer by E.M. Bounds

Excerpt from chapter 3

When we calmly reflect upon the fact that the progress of our Lord's Kingdom is dependent upon prayer, it is sad to think that we give so little time to the holy exercise. Everything depends upon prayer, and yet we neglect it not only to our own spiritual hurt but also to the delay and injury of our Lord's cause upon the earth. The forces of good and evil are contending for the world. If we would, we could add to the conquering power of the army of righteousness, and yet our lips are sealed, our hands hang listlessly by our side, and we jeopardize the very cause in which we profess to be deeply interested by holding back from the prayer chamber.

Prayer is the one prime, eternal condition by which the Father is pledged to put the Son in possession of the world. Christ prays through His people. Had there been importunate, universal and continuous prayer by God's people, long ere this the earth had been possessed for Christ. The delay is not to be accounted for by the inveterate obstacles, but by the lack of the right asking. We do more of everything else than of praying. As poor as our giving is, our contributions of money exceed our offerings of prayer. Perhaps in the average congregation fifty aid in paying, where one saintly, ardent soul shuts itself up with God and wrestles for the deliverance of the heathen world. Official praying on set or state occasions counts for nothing in this estimate. We emphasize other things more than we do the necessity of prayer.

We are saying prayers after an orderly way, but we have not the world in the grasp of our faith. We are not praying after the order that moves God and brings all Divine influences to help us. The world needs more true praying to save it from the reign and ruin of Satan.

### Thursday, June 23, 2016 –A Visit to Decatur

Stalely home was originally built in 1884 by William J. Quinlan. The Staley family occupied the home from 1913 to 1951. After multiple owners, the home is now owned by the Staley Museum Foundation and has recently been restored to the original floor plan. Admission fee is \$3.00 per person. Seniors (age 50 plus) are encouraged to participate, enjoy the fellowship, and learn a few things about our surrounding communities. ### Thursday, August 11, 2016---A Visit to Terre Haute

Seniors, we will continue our travel adventures by heading east to Terre Haute where we will eat lunch at either Panera or MCL and then visit the CANDLES Holocaust Museum and Education Center. CANDLES is an acronym for Children of Auschwitz Nazi Deadly Lab Experiments Survivors. The CANDLES organization was founded in 1984 by Eva Mozes Kor with help from her twin sister to launch an effort to locate other surviving Mengele twins. In 1985 Eva Opened the CANDLES Holocaust Museum and Education Center in Terre Haute. Although the museum was firebombed and destroyed in 2003, it reopened in 2005 with the support of the community. CANDLES Holocaust Museum and Education Center is the only organization in the world dedicated to the memory of the twin victims and survivors of medical experimentation at Auschwitz.

Less we forget, the Holocaust (1933-1945) was the "systematic bureaucratic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of nearly six million Jews and five million others including Gypsies, Polish Christians, and Jehovah's Witnesses by the Nazi regime. It was a historical turning point in which the world witnessed genocide at its extremity. Yet, today we see and read about the persecution of Christians, Jews, and other groups in our world. Seniors this is a great opportunity to educate ourselves about past events, enjoy the fellowship of other seniors, and remember and pray for those being persecuted as well as the persecutors. The quarterly international mission spotlight is on H.I.S. Home For Children, an orphanage located in Port-Au-Prince, Haiti.



Adoption is not possible for all the children brought to them, so H.I.S. HOME has worked diligently to develop programs for the children in their care that will spend their

lives in Haiti. H.I.S. HOME welcomes and cares for many special needs children, many who are severely or multiply impaired. Through proper nutrition, therapies, medical interventions and loving care, they strive to provide the best long term solutions for these unique and special children.

H.I.S. Home for Children is an IRS registered 501c3 charitable organization, **VBS**

So what does a youth minister do all summer? This is a question that youth ministers around the country get asked every summer. I will endeavor to answer this question for you, because I know many people don't understand why most youth groups take breaks during the summer.

My first goal this summer is to plan and write a new small group curriculum to begin in the fall. The leadership team and I have taken a look at our group and decided that we need some time of deeper digging into God's word. This fall we plan to dig into the book of Daniel and see how it applies to the lives of youth today. There are so many good lessons to learn from Daniel and his friends actions. They were mere teenagers when they were ripped from their homes and forced to work for king Nebuchadnezzar. When asked to compromise their faith, Daniel and his friends stood up and glorified God's name. I hope to show the kids why and how to stand up for God in the face of certain social death. Plus it has cool stories about lions and furnaces and a crazy king that eats grass like an ox.

The second goal I have for the summer (with all of God's grace) is to plan and write lessons for both the high school and middle school classes.

This past year we worked through the attributes of God and some of Jesus' miracles. For next year, I am still waiting for the Holy Spirit to guide me down that path. (If God gives you a message for me, I am ready for it)

This July we are also planning on having our "Hang Out" time for 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders. Every Monday through Thursday in July we will open up the gym and let the kids come and hang out. We spend time playing kickball, basketball, 4square, Xbox, Wii, gaga ball and sometime digging into God's word. Last year we saw over 30 kids and averaged at least 15 each day. Many of these kids then started to attend youth group in the fall.

I will also be taking a group of high schoolers to CIY this summer. We will be going to Macomb, IL this year. I am excited that we are taking some students who did not get the opportunity to go last year. I can't wait to see how God works in their lives.

VBS is also a busy time for me. This year's theme is God's Treasures and I will be helping Joni and Katy to plan and run VBS this June. I always love to see all those smiling faces every year and hear them sing songs, bringing praises to our King.

I almost forgot to mention that I will also be going to Oil Belt to help with Deeper Life. I have never had to opportunity to go to this camp, so I am really looking forward to a great time of serving God and seeing kids grow deeper to Christ.

They call it summer break, but I think I am going to be quite busy this summer. But how glorious it is to be busy doing HIS work.
