There are times when the Bible is sublimely practical. In his first letter to the church at Corinth, Paul offers this instruction:

Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him.

— 1 Corinthians 7:17

Survivors. The CANDLES organization was
founded in 1984 by Eva Mozes Kor, with help
from her twin sister, to launch an effort to
locate other surviving Mengele twins.
In 1985, Eva Opened the CANDLES Holocaust
Museum and Education Center in Terre Haute.
Community support helped it reopen in 2005
after the museum was firebombed and
destroyed in 2003. CANDLES Holocaust
Museum and Education Center is the only
organization in the world dedicated to the
memory of the twin victims and survivors of
medical experimentation at Auschwitz.

Admission for CANDLES is \$5.00. To help us plan, sign-up registration will be available in the Fellowship Center on July 24, 31, and August 7.
